Libby plans to make a splash in Adelaide

TRIPLE Olympic gold medallist **Libby Trickett** can't wait to make her Adelaide swimming debut at the new State Aquatic Centre in Marion later this year.

"I've never swum in Adelaide so it's going to be really exciting," Libby says. "I have a few friends down there and I'll get to visit what I hear is a beautiful city."

The 26-year-old, on the comeback trail after nine months away from swimming, will race in a 100m freestyle time trial on June 29, with the goal of making the World Championships team.

Libby says she has recently been in contact with Australia's other comeback kids – **Ian Thorpe**, **Michael Klim** and **Geoff Huegill** – as they take aim at next year's



London Olympics. "It's funny how we've all decided to come back to the pool and race again," she says.

Meanwhile, Libby has joined forces with Cadbury Chocolate to promote Fair Trade Fortnight, an initiative that benefits farmers in developing countries.

Held from May 7 to 22, the project encourages people to use

Fairtrade products, which ensure better working conditions for labourers in Ghana and other developing nations.

"I've seen first-hand the difference this program (Fairtrade) can make . . . Not many people understand the impact it can have on farmers in these countries," Libby says.
